
The Letters of Paul

Three Main Groups of Letters

- THE JOURNEY LETTERS (approx. AD 48-56) Galatians, 1 & 2 Thessalonians, 1 & 2 Corinthians, Romans
- 2. THE PRISON LETTERS (early AD 60's) Colossians, Ephesians, Philemon, Philippians
- 3. THE PASTORAL LETTERS (mid AD 60's) 1 Timothy, Titus, 2 Timothy
 Written to Timothy & Titus 2 apostolic delegates (team approach)
 T & T in specific locations dealing with difficulties in local churches
 Vitally important WHY? Paul's last writings

Who Timothy Was

- Natural Son "of a certain Jewish woman who believed, but his father was Greek" (Acts 16 v 1). Mother Eunice, Grandmother Lois (2 Tim 1 v 5)
- Saved on Paul's first missionary journey? (Acts 14 v 6, 2 Tim 1 v 5)
- Spiritual Son "who is my beloved & faithful son in the Lord" 1 Cor 4 v
 17); "a true son (child) in the faith" (1 Tim 1 v 2)
- Disciple who "was well spoken of by the brethren" (Acts 16 v 1-2)
- Companion of Paul, on 2nd & 3rd missionary journeys, & beyond
- Trusted dispatched by Paul to various assemblies
- Faithful with Paul to the very end (2 Tim 4 v 9-21)



Paul's opinion:-

"I have no one likeminded" (Phil 3 v 20)

➤ "my fellow worker" (Rom 16 v 21)

▶ "our brother"

(Col 1 v 1)

➤ "a servant of God"

What Timothy Did - 1

- Learnt Acts 16 v 1-2
- Served "he sent into Macedonia two of those who ministered to him, Timothy & Erastus" (Acts 19 v 22)
- Reminded "Timothy...will remind you of my ways in Christ" (1 Cor 4 v 17)
 Worked "he does the work of the Lord" (1 Cor 16 v 10)
- \circ Preached 2 Cor 1 v 19
- Established, Encouraged & Reported back to Paul 1 Thess 3 v 1-6
- Commanded "remain in Ephesus that you may charge some that they teach no other doctrine" (1 Tim 1 v 3)

What Timothy Did - 2

- Confessed his own convictions 1 Tim 6 v 12
- Cried "being mindful of your tears (2 Tim 1 v 4)
- Believed "the genuine faith that is in you" (2 Tim 1 v 5)
- Used "stir up the gift of God which is in you" (2 Tim 1 v 6)
- Listened "the things that you have heard from me" (2 Tim 2 v 2)

Vhat Are

• Carefully Followed Paul - 2 Tim 3 v 10-11

• Knew - the OT Scriptures from childhood (2 Tim 3 v 15)

Why Did Paul Write This Letter?

- 1. To Pass On Doctrine About the Local Church
- 2. To Pass On A Warning About False Doctrine
- 3. To Encourage Timothy In His Responsibility

REMEMBER – Timothy was at EPHESUS...

Doctrine:

- Teaching, instruction
- EITHER the act of teaching OR the content of what is taught

Doctrine is clear and systematic thinking about divine things.

In Paul's letters to Timothy doctrine is very closely linked to:

- TRUTH = teaching that is true
- FAITH = teaching I can trust
- GODLINESS = teaching that transforms

Why Did Paul Write This Letter?1. To Pass On Doctrine About the Local Church

"I write <u>so that you may know</u> how you ought to conduct yourself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar & ground of the truth" (1 Tim 3 v 15)

A HOUSEHOLD BELONGING TO GOD - so there is teaching about:

- private & public matters
- male & female
- employees & employers
- rich & poor
- elders & servants (deacons)
- Godliness (3 v 16) CHRIST is the TRUTH

Why Did Paul Write This Letter?

2. To Pass On A Warning About False Doctrine

"As I urged you when I went into Macedonia - remain in Ephesus that you may charge some <u>that they teach no other doctrine</u>, nor give heed to fables & endless genealogies, which cause disputes rather than godly edification which is in faith" (1 Tim 1 v 3-4)

HOW TO DEAL WITH FALSE DOCTRINE:

- ➢ 1 Tim 4 v 7 Reject
- ➤ 1 Tim 6 v 5 Withdraw
- ➢ 2 Tim 2 v 16-18 Shun
- > 2 Tim 2 v 23-26 Avoid & Correct

- ➤ 2 Tim 3 v 1-9 Turn Away
- ➤ 2 Tim 4 v 14-15 Beware

AND ultimately (by local church)

> 1 Tim 1 v 19-20 - Deliver (to restore)

Why Did Paul Write This Letter?

3. To Encourage Timothy In His Responsibility

"But reject profane & old wives' fables, & <u>exercise yourself toward godliness</u>. For bodily exercise profits a little, but godliness is profitable for all things, having promise of the life that now is & of that which is to come" (1 Tim 4 v 7-8)

"Let no one despise your youth, but <u>be an example</u> to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity. Till I come, <u>give attention to</u> reading, to exhortation, to doctrine. <u>Do not neglect</u> the gift that is in you...<u>Meditate</u> on these things; <u>give yourself entirely</u> to them, that your progress may be evident to all. <u>Take heed</u> to yourself & to the doctrine. <u>Continue</u> in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself & those who hear you" (1 Tim 4 v 12-16)

"But you, O man of God, flee these things & pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness. Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life" (1 Tim 6 v 11-12)
